





Numbers reflect November 4, 2023 - November 9, 2024


2024 Grants

SCAMP received grants from: Wendell and Doris Rogers Foundation, Eagles For Children, Clarkston Optimist Club, Michigan Elks Major Project, Michigan Arts & Culture Council, and the Zonta Club of Flint. Money from these grants went to SCAMPerships and the operating expenses of camp.

Camp Costs

Many families with children who have special needs experience overwhelming medical and care-giving expenses. Therefore, our primary concern is keeping the camp affordable. The cost of sending a camper to SCAMP is approximately \$2,100. Families are asked to pay a portion of this if they are able, but over 50% are not. A financial aid packet is included with every application. No SCAMPers has ever been turned away for financial reasons.


